

# CHALLENGE CONDITIONS

In all match play competitions, the challenger (top name/s of the draw sheet) must offer three dates including a Saturday or a Sunday to the opposition (the lower name/s). This offer should be as soon as possible but **NOT LESS THAN** ten days before the final date for the round and there should be at least seven days between the first and last dates offered. If the challenged party/ies cannot play on the dates offered, they must propose a mutually acceptable date or forfeit the match.

It is recommended that challenges be made as soon as possible after both names are known and that if the challenger has not made contact by the ten days, the challenged party should make the contact.

**NOTE :** In match play competitions where no name/s has been put forward by the last date for the round, and no extension has been granted, the challenger/s (upper name/s) shall be scratched from the competition.

Extensions to due dates will not be granted for any round of a draw up to the semi-final round, and extension to a due date from that point, will only be considered by application to Committee prior to the date of the semi-final or final round as posted on the original draw sheet. Such extension will be at the discretion of the Committee and will not be further extended.

Where games finish all square, play must continue until a hole is won, with strokes observed.
